Why Apply for a Grant?

Remediating a brownfield site can get expensive very quickly

The EPA provides financial support for brownfield inventories, assessing, cleaning up, and planning for redevelopment of brownfield sites

> EPA grants provide opportunities for site remediation that may not otherwise be available to you by reducing liability concerns which could open avenues for redevelopment partnerships

Multipurpose Grant



Best for communities that have identified a discrete area with one or more brownfield sites.

Range of activities, including:

- Developing prioritized inventories of brownfield sites;
- Conducting community engagement activities;
- Conducting environmental site assessments;
- Developing cleanup plans and reuse plans related to brownfield sites;
- Conducting cleanup activities on brownfield sites owned by the applicant; and
- Developing an overall plan for revitalization.

Assessment Grants

Provide funding for brownfield inventories, planning activities, environmental assessments, and community outreach.

- Inventory, prioritize, and assess sites
- Conduct site redevelopment planning
- Conduct community involvement and facilitate area wide planning
- Advance local cleanup and redevelopment planning centered around a brownfields-impacted area (site-specific cleanup, reuse plans)
- Develop area-wide plans or other planning activities and identify next steps and resources needed to implement the plan



Types of Assessment Grants



Community Wide: Recommended for communities who are beginning to address brownfield issues as well that those who have ongoing efforts. Appropriate when a community has no identified specific site but plans to spend funds on more than one site in the community.



Coalition: Designed for one "lead" eligible entity to partner with 2+ other eligible entities. The lead member may submit one grant proposal under the names of the members and perform assessment grant activities in each coalition member's community.



State and Tribal: Available to states, tribes, and eligible native corporations in Alaska to address brownfield sites throughout their entire jurisdiction.

Revolving Loan Fund Grants

Provide funding to capitalize a revolving loan fund that provides loans and subgrants to carry out cleanup of brownfield sites.

Used to provide no-interest or low-interest loans for eligible brownfield cleanups, subgrants for cleanups and other eligible programmatic costs

Can apply as an individual entity or as part of an RLF Coalition

Subgrants are typically limited to \$500,000 per site

Cleanup Grants

- Provide funding for cleanup activities at a single site or multiple sites owned by the applicant
- Includes program
 reporting, cleanup
 oversight, environmental
 monitoring
- Sampling activities and cleanup alternatives with specific cost estimates are required



Extra Steps for Cleanup Grants

- Timing of ownership transfer
- Public meeting required to be held prior to submittal
- Community notification (no later than 2 weeks before application submittal)
 - Providing notice of public meeting (date/time) for grant application
 - o Providing location of draft ABCA available for review



Assessment Grants	Up to \$500k, \$200k/site cap	Up to \$10M, no site cap
RLF Grants	Up to \$1M, 20% cost share	Up to \$10M, no cost share
Cleanup Grants	Up to \$650k (with waiver), 20% cost share	Up to \$5M, no cost share

Inventory Your Site(s)

Brownfields are in every community – it's a matter of how *large* and how *many* they are

Identifying your site(s) is a first step in redevelopment process

You cannot begin the redevelopment process without knowing your inventory

Through our **Inventory Support Program** your community can create an inventory of potential brownfield sites





All Appropriate Inquiry (AAI)



Cleanup Grant applications require the applicant to own the property, which means...

... you must have completed AAI within 180 days of the property transfer.

- AAI is performed to determine potential environmental concerns on the property.
- AAI may include a Phase I ESA

AAI is an important step because the assessment:

- Protects you from liability
- Makes you eligible for EPA funding
- Makes you aware of assets and liability on your property

Whatever You Do...


Do NOT take ownership of a property without first conducting All Appropriate Inquiry (AAI) if applying for a Cleanup or Multi-Purpose Grant!!





Where do You Even Begin?

- To apply for EPA grants, you **must** complete:
 - Registration with SAM.gov
 - Registration with Grants.gov
 - Conduct AAI on your site(s) only if applying for a Cleanup or Multipurpose Grant







To apply for EPA grants, you must be registered at SAM.gov.

- The System for Award Management (SAM) is a free, official website of the U.S. government.
 - Register to do business with the U.S. government
 - Update or renew your entity registration
 - Check status of an entity registration
 - Search for entity registration and exclusion records
- Can take at least 2 weeks or more to complete **don't wait**!
- If your organization has applied for federal funding in the past, you may already have a SAM.gov account and number.





Grants.gov is a centralized location for users to find and apply for federal funding opportunities.




All grants must be submitted through this site, it is the federal clearinghouse for funding opportunities

Homework – Starting Now!

Determine your eligibility for EPA Brownfield grants

ID Project – Define your project, purpose of project, preliminary scope of project, anticipated project results

Site Inventory – Compile site information (name, location, ownership, site history, site status, etc.) and sites prioritized

Assessment Reports - Confirm that assessment documentation is complete and meets AAI requirements Redevelopment Plans – Potential site re-use plans, sites with redevelopment plans completed or in-progress

For Cleanup Grant Applications – property transfer, site eligibility Community Engagement – identify community partners, outreach efforts, community needs

Determine If Environmental Assessment Work is Complete

Sam.gov and Grants.gov – check to make sure you're registered and up to date for application submittal Need BAC help? We can help, but with limited resources and multiple projects and activities on-going, contact the BAC's ASAP for assistance.
