US EPA Brownfields Program

Provides grants and technical assistance to communities, states, tribes and others to assess, safely clean up and sustainably reuse contaminated properties.





Assessment Grants


- Provide funding to:
 - Inventory, prioritize, and assess sites
 - Conduct site redevelopment planning
 - Conduct community involvement and facilitate area wide planning
 - Advance local cleanup and redevelopment planning centered around a brownfields-impacted area (sitespecific cleanup, reuse plans)
 - Develop area-wide plans or other planning activities and identify next steps and resources needed to implement the plan



What is an Environmental Assessment?

A report that identifies potential or existing environmental contamination liabilities

Completed by a Qualified Environmental Professional





What is an Environmental Assessment?

Phase I ESA

- Examines current and historical uses of the site
- Uses existing information to identify potential threats to health/environment

Phase II ESA

- Recommend if Phase I indicates known or potential contamination
- Includes:
 - Identifying potential contaminants
 - Sampling of soil, ground water, and other media
 - Targeted sampling



Why would I need an assessment?

- BEFORE a property transfer for:
 - For certain liability protections
 - Potential funding eligibility
- Better understand the state of the property and costs for remediation or redevelopment

Assessment Grants for States

- Allow state entities with high capacity to assist communities or organizations without capacity or need for a full grant
- Helps to build additional brownfield capacity in communities
- Faster than applying for your own especially if you only have one target site

Our Mission:


Assessing and remediating contaminated properties for beneficial use to provide for clean, safe, and productive West Virginia communities.



- Purpose Help WV communities to redevelop underutilized properties in their communities (brownfields)
- USEPA grant funds environmental property assessment at brownfields sites, such as Phase I and II Environmental Site Assessments, Asbestos Inspections, Lead-Based Paint Surveys, and Reuse Planning

Target Areas*

- Ohio River Valley Region (Jackson, Pleasants, Tyler, Wood, and Wetzel Counties)
- Potomac Highlands Region (Grant, Hampshire, Hardy, Mineral, and Pendleton Counties)
- Southern Coalfields Region (Logan, McDowell, Mercer, Mingo, and Wyoming Counties)
 - *Assessments may be performed statewide

Brownfield Community Advisory Team - Representatives from community partners and others

Funding environmental assessments can free up other county and municipal funding sources for redevelopment of priority sites



- STEP 1 Public outreach
- STEP 2 Develop a brownfield site inventory
- STEP 3 Prioritize sites for assessment
- STEP 4 Conduct Environmental Site Assessments and reuse planning
- STEP 5 Follow-up meetings and project updates throughout the grant period (5 years from 2022 through 2027)
